- The German concern Rheinmetall plans to start the production of armored vehicles in Ukraine in 2024. The company expects to be able to conclude an agreement with Ukraine on the production of Fuchs armored personnel carriers and Lynx infantry fighting vehicles by the beginning of next year. Rheinmetall has also received an order to produce 155-mm artillery shells for Ukraine for 142 million euros. Ammunition will be delivered in 2025.
- Germany has trained a second group of Ukrainian soldiers to operate the Patriot air defense system. About 70 soldiers and officers of the Ukrainian Armed Forces took the course. It lasted more than six weeks.
- The American state of North Carolina has recognized the Holodomor man-made famine of 1932-1933 as genocide of the Ukrainian people. This is the 35th state to make such a decision.
- The Lithuanian government has contributed one million euros to the Solidarity Fund for Ukraine, a trust fund of the Council of Europe Development Bank (CEB) aimed at improving the living conditions of Ukrainians and supporting recovery efforts.
- Ukraine has started consultations with the EU on collective security guarantees as a follow-up to the G7 declaration of support for Ukraine signed during the NATO summit in Vilnius.
- Finland will produce artillery ammunition for Ukraine. Defense Minister Antti Häkkänen said that the final decision on the start of production is likely to be made by Christmas.
- Belgium confirms its intention to provide Ukraine with F-16 fighter jets in 2025. Defense Minister Rustem Umerov discussed with his Belgian counterpart the transfer of aircraft and necessary equipment and the training of Ukrainian pilots.
- The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) will provide Ukraine with 20,000 tons of metal for the construction of second-level facilities to protect energy facilities from Russian attacks. The State Agency reported this for the Restoration and Development of Infrastructure of Ukraine.
- Slovenia will donate 1.5 million euros to Ukraine on a non-refundable basis for humanitarian demining by the end of this year, the press service of the Ministry of Economy of Ukraine reports.
- The World Bank will provide Ukraine with a 1.2 billion dollar loan for social payments in 2024. The Ministry of Social Policy and the World Bank have signed an agreement to launch a new project called "Investing in Social Protection for Increased Coverage, Resilience, and Efficiency (INSPIRE)." The press service of the Ministry of Social Policy reported this.
- The ambassadors of the Baltic states in Warsaw have delivered a demarche against the Polish authorities over the hauliers' blockade of Ukrainian border crossings, saying it is undermining Ukraine's ability to resist the full-scale Russian invasion.
- The UK has announced a winter humanitarian aid package of 37 million pounds sterling, the British government has announced. This is a part of the total humanitarian aid to Ukraine worth 127 million pounds sterling in 2023-2024. In addition, the UK will impose a series of sanctions against suppliers of military equipment to Russia.
- For the first time, the United States has opened a war crimes case against Russian military personnel in Ukraine. They kidnapped and tortured an American in the village of Mylove, Kherson region. This case is the first time that the US Department of Justice has prosecuted those who commit war crimes against American citizens abroad. The suspects were charged with four counts.
 - The United Štates announced additional assistance to Ukraine worth 175 million dollars. The new package includes air defense equipment, additional ammunition for HIMARS systems, artillery ammunition, AGM-88 HARM anti-radar missiles, and anti-tank missiles.

- Prime Minister Fumio Kishida announced that Japan will allocate 4.5 billion dollars for the reconstruction of Ukraine.
- Ukraine and the United States signed a memorandum on joint weapons production and exchange of technical data. This includes hybrid air defense systems, which will be developed by the Pentagon, the Ministry of Defense of Ukraine, and the Ministry of Strategic Industries of Ukraine. Ukraine has already been provided with technologies to start production of such air defense systems as part of the FrankenSAM program.
- Australia is transferring an additional batch of Bushmaster MRAPs. This was announced on the social network X (formerly Twitter) by Australian Ambassador to Ukraine Edwards: "Not much says Merry Christmas to a close friend far across the seas quite as well as saving lives. Proud to see the role of Bushmasters recognized among key military assistance provided to Ukraine. And more are on their way!"
- Ukraine and Germany have signed agreements to provide financial assistance of 41.2 million euros for implementing the project "Housing for Internally Displaced Persons" and creating energy-efficient housing for Ukrainian IDPs. This was announced by Iryna Vereshchuk, Deputy Prime Minister of Ukraine and Minister for Reintegration of the Temporarily Occupied Territories of Ukraine.

- This month, Ukraine will receive all 14 Vampire counter-drone systems ordered as part of the military aid. The press service of the US Naval Air Systems Command reported on this. These systems were developed specifically for Ukraine to detect and intercept enemy drones, including Shahed-136.
- Bulgaria's Defense Committee has approved assistance in training Ukrainian pilots on F-16 fighter jets. The country will also train up to four Ukrainian infantry or mechanized companies with a total of 160 soldiers. The Committee approved the transfer of obsolete anti-aircraft missile systems, manportable air defense systems (MANPADS) and surface-to-air missiles of different types to Ukraine to strengthen its air defense. Bulgaria claims that Ukraine may be able to return the defective missiles to service.
- US President Joe Biden and G7 leaders met with Ukrainian President Zelensky online and agreed to ban Russian diamonds. Non-industrial Russian diamonds are scheduled to be banned by January, and Russian diamonds sold by third countries will be sanctioned starting in March 2024.
- Ukraine has received a modern unmanned reconnaissance aircraft system Luna NG as part of military aid from Germany. The German government announced the transfer of this unmanned system on its website. The government website disclosed the contents of the new military aid package for Ukraine, which includes Vector reconnaissance drones, HK GMW automatic grenade launchers, Zetros trucks, border protection vehicles, and first aid kits.
- The Estonian company Milrem Robotics has signed an agreement with the Ukrainian Defense Industry (Ukroboronprom) to start forging next-generation multi-domain robotic defense systems. The company's press service reported on this. It is about systems based on the THeMIS multipurpose platform, in particular, the THeMIS Combat combat system armed with a machine gun module, the Combat Engineering version adapted for mine detection and demining, as well as unmanned logistics vehicles and their modified CASEVAC versions for evacuating the wounded.



- > The Russian Federation continues to wage a war of aggression and keeps ignoring the laws and customs of warfare, using terror tactics, striking and shelling both military and civilian targets. As a result of the Russian terrorist attacks, there are dead and wounded, destruction and damage to private residential buildings and other civilian infrastructure.
- > In the Volyn and Polissia directions, the operational situation has not significantly changed. There were no signs of the offensive group's formation.
- In the Chernihiv and Kharkiv directions, the enemy maintains a military presence in the border areas, conducts sabotage and intelligence activities, attacks populated areas from the territory of the Russian Federation and increases the density of mines and explosives barriers along the state border of Ukraine.
- > In the Kupiansk direction, Ukrainian defenders repelled a number of enemy attacks in the Sinkivka and Ivanivka districts of the Kharkiv Oblast.
- In the Lyman direction, the Defense Forces repelled an attack by the enemy who tried to dislodge Ukrainian units from the occupied lines in the Spirne area of Donetsk Oblast. In addition, the enemy carried out airstrikes in the areas of Serebrianskyi Forestry of Luhansk Oblast and Serebrianka of Donetsk Oblast.
- > In the Bakhmut direction, the Defense Forces repelled a number of enemy attacks in the Bohdanivka, Ivanovske, Klishchiivka, and Andriivka areas.
- > In the Avdiivka direction, Ukrainian defenders repelled a number of attacks where the enemy, with the support of aviation, unsuccessfully tried to break through the defenses.
- In the Marinka direction, Ukrainian troops continue to hold back the enemy in the areas of Krasnohorivka, Marinka, Pobieda, and Novomykhailivka, where the Russians launched several unsuccessful attacks. The enemy did not conduct offensive (assault) actions in the Shakhtarsk direction.
- > In the Zaporizhzhia direction, the Defense Forces repelled an enemy attack in the area west of Verbove.
- > In the Kherson direction, the city of Kherson and villages of the Kherson Oblast were subjected to Russian artillery fire.

✓ During the past week, Russians launched 49 missile and 405 air strikes and fired over 480 MLRS attacks.

Attack on the night of December 5

Air defense forces shot down 10 of 17 Shahed drones. The Russians also used six S-300 missiles against civilian targets in Donetsk and Kherson oblasts.

Attack on the night of December 6

Air defense forces shot down 41 of 48 Shahed drones. In the Lviv oblast, three drones hit an infrastructure facility. No one was injured.

Attack on the night of December 7

Russians attacked Ukraine with 18 attack drones, 15 of which were destroyed by air defense forces. The main areas of the attack were Odesa and Khmelnytskyi oblasts. As a result of the drone attack in Odesa oblast, port infrastructure was damaged: a warehouse, an elevator, and trucks were damaged. The driver of one of the trucks was killed.

Attack on the night of December 8

Russia fired 20 X-101/X-555 cruise missiles, an Iskander-M ballistic missile, and six S-300 missiles at Ukraine. The Air Force destroyed 14 X-101/X-555 cruise missiles.

- The massive missile attack in the Dnipropetrovsk oblast caused destruction in Pavlohrad, Ternivka, and Yuriivska communities. An industrial enterprise was damaged. 16 private and 5 country houses and a church were damaged.
- Russians fired 6 S-300 missiles at Kharkiv. Two people were wounded. A playground and other civilian objects were among the "targets". Residential buildings, an educational institution, and about 20 cars were damaged. The enemy also attacked Kurylivka in the Kupiansk district with multiple rocket launchers. Two floors of a 5-story residential building burned as a result of the shelling. Podoly of Kupyansk district also came under fire. Three civilians were wounded: a man of 56 years old and women of 50 and 69 years old.
- About 10 bomber-missile carriers fired X-101/555 cruise missiles in the direction of Kyiv. Air defense forces shot down all enemy targets on the approach to the capital. In the Kyiv oblast, the falling debris damaged private homes in several communities.

Donetsk oblast

Vuhledar, Novoukrainka, and Bohoiavlenka came under fire in the Volnovakha sector.

In the Donetsk sector, Kurakhove, Hrodivka, Marinka, Ocheretyne communities, Avdiivka, Krasnohorivka, Novomykhailivka, Katerynivka, Soloviove, Kurakhove, Trudove, Dalne, Selydove, Kostiantynivka, Stepove, Berdychi, Novokalynove, Heorhiivka, Novoekonomichne are affected. Multi-story buildings, administrative buildings, and private houses were damaged.

In the Horlivka sector, Soledar, Andriivka, Toretsk, Chasiv Yar communities, Toretsk, Pivnichne, Rozdolivka, Vasiukivka, Nelipivka, Minkivka, Shcherbynivka came under fire. Residential buildings, administrative buildings, infrastructure facilities, the territory of an enterprise, high-rise buildings, an infrastructure facility, and an industrial building were damaged.

In the Lysychansk sector, Siversk, Lyman, Zvanivka, Serebrianka, Torske, Zarichne, Verkhniokamianske, Pereizne, Yampil, and Siversk communities are affected. Private houses were damaged. There are wounded or dead in all directions.

Kherson and Kherson oblast

Over the past week, Russians shelled Kherson and the oblast more than 500 times.

On December 3, Russians shelled one of the settlements in the Kherson district. A shell hit a garage, killing a 78year-old man. On that day, Russian occupiers struck the Central District of Kherson. They hit a multi-story building. Seven people were injured, two died. On December 4, Russians shelled a kindergarten in the Shumenskyi district of Kherson. The walls of the building were damaged, and windows were smashed. One person was injured. A suburb of Kherson was also shelled. Three people who were carrying out repair work on the street were wounded. A man died as a result of the shelling of Antonivka. On December 5, two people died and eight were wounded in the shelling of Kherson. One of the medical institutions was hit. On the night of December 6, Russians shelled Kherson several times. One person was wounded. As a result of the attack, a car caught fire, and three other cars were hit by shrapnel. A medical facility and houses were also damaged. On December 7, the Russians attacked Tiahynka, injuring four people. Also in the evening, Russian occupiers shelled residential areas of Kherson, a 46-year-old woman was wounded. On December 9, Russians dropped explosives from a drone on Beryslav, one person was injured and one died.

Kharkiv oblast

On December 3, a 5-storey apartment building was damaged as a result of shelling in Kupiansk-Vuzlovyi, Kuiyansk district. On December 5, Russian invaders attacked Borova, Izium district, with Shahed drones. A house of culture, a shop, and private houses were damaged. On the same day, in Chuhuiv, three houses were damaged as a result of two UAVs hitting them, windows were smashed and roofs were damaged. A 41-year-old man was injured, he was not hospitalized. On December 6, a gas pipe, an outpatient clinic, private houses, and a car were damaged in Kozachya Lopan as a result of hostile shelling. There were no casualties. In Lypky, a residential building was destroyed as a result of a drone attack, and critical infrastructure was damaged. On December 7, the village of Podoly in the Kupiansk district was shelled. Women aged 58 and 49 sustained shrapnel wounds to their lower limbs. A private house was damaged. The shelling of Kupiansk damaged the facade of the administrative building. In Kozachya Lopan, private houses were burning as a result of the shelling by the guided aerial bombs. The 3-storey building of the enterprise was also damaged, and the windows of the railway station were smashed. Russians also struck Kurylivka, Kupiansk district, at least 4 times. There were damage to private houses, without casualties.

Udy, Čhervona Zoria, Stohnii of Bohodukhiv district, Hraniv, Veterynarne of Kharkiv district, Vovchansk, Pletenivka, Budarky of Chuhuiv district, Dvorichna, Synkivka, Petropavlivka, Ivanivka, Berestove, Kyslivka, Tabaivka, Krokhmalne, Chuhunivka, Krasne Pershe of Kupiansk district were also under fire.

Zaporizhzhia oblast

During the week, Russians fired over 700 times at Zaporizhzhya Oblast. Huliaipole, Zaliznychne, Novodarivka, Charivne, Chervone, Mala Tokmachka, Luhivske, Novodanylivka, Bilohiria, Levadne, Poltavka, Robotyne, Plavni, Kamianske, Stepove, Mali Shcherbaky, Piatykhatky, Malynivka, Novopavlivka, Novoandriivka, Vasylivka district, Orikhiv, Stepnohirsk, Temyrivka, Novotroitske, Lobkove, Verkhnia Tersa were under fire.



- Oleksandr Prokudin, head of the Kherson Regional Military Administration claims that in the deoccupied Kherson Oblast, 836 houses have been repaired as part of the Side by Side project, while another 769 houses have been restored by volunteers and charitable organizations.
- Russian Internet providers have blocked access to Ukrainian radio stations in the temporarily occupied Sevastopol, as reported by Krym.Realii. After the start of the full-scale invasion, access to the majority of Ukrainian media in Sevastopol was blocked. Although several Ukrainian radio stations remained available, this is no longer the case.
- On December 4, a rehabilitation center for soldiers named after Oleh Kravets started operating in test mode in Uzhhorod. This update was provided by the press service of the Uzhhorod City Council.
- The National Resistance Center reports that Russian occupiers are preparing for fake elections in the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine. In the spring of 2024, elections are scheduled in the Russian Federation to imitate the legitimacy of Russian President Vladimir Putin's current term in office. By December 12, the Russians will decide on elections in the temporarily occupied territories of Kherson, Zaporizhzhia, Donetsk, and Luhansk Oblasts of Ukraine.
- President Volodymyr Zelenskyi mentioned that over seven million tons of cargo had already been transported through the 'grain corridor' created by Ukraine in the Black Sea after Russia withdrew from the 'grain deal'.
- The Center for National Resistance reported that Russians planned to spread propaganda through international scientific libraries. The invaders plan to fill international scientific libraries with propaganda literature endorsing the historical affiliation of the temporarily occupied regions of Ukraine with the Russian Federation. The purpose of the provocation is to simulate support for Moscow's military aggression among academics.
- In the temporarily occupied territories, Russians are establishing pseudo-patriotic centers to mobilize minors. The Russian special training center 'Warrior' is set to operate in the temporarily occupied Luhansk. Children aged 14 and older will be sent for military training, while those aged 16 and above will be immediately prepared for mobilization, which is a serious breach of the Geneva Convention.
- With the mediation of Qatar, the team of the Office and the Verkhovna Rada Commissioner for Human Rights Dmytro Lubinets managed to return eight more Ukrainian children from the occupation. The age of the returned children ranges from 8 to 18 years old.
- From the temporarily occupied Askania-Nova Biosphere Reserve in Kherson Oblast, Russians illegally exported animals listed in the Red Book to Russia. This was announced by the Minister of Environmental Protection and Natural Resources of Ukraine Ruslan Strilets. Several Chapman's zebras, American bison, Przewalski's horses, and Père David's deer were taken from the Askania zoo. All these species are listed in the Red Book and the Red List of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).
- Russian aggressors declared the evacuation of civilians from the territory of the temporarily occupied Nova Kakhovka in Kherson Oblast, as reported by the adviser to the head of the Kherson regional military administration Serhii Khlan. According to Khlan, it is currently unknown where the Russians plan to evacuate civilians. During previous evacuations, people ended up in 'the most desolate areas of Russia'.

- Another family was rescued from the temporarily occupied Kherson Oblast. The foster family could not leave the Left Bank on their own, as mentioned by Oleksandr Prokudin, the head of the Kherson Regional Military Administration. An 18-year-old girl from Hola Prystan, who was illegally deported to Russia, was repatriated with her family.
- Dmytro Lubinets, Ombudsman, stated that there are 28,000 Ukrainian civilians in Russian captivity, suggesting a planned system of suppressing resistance. He officially confirmed the destability of the state of
- deportation of 19,540 Ukrainian children. "If we return one child every day, it will take us 55 years. And this is in the context of the fact that the Russian Federation continues to deport more and more
- groups of Ukrainian children from the territory of our country every day," Lubinets said. The government has many initiatives to return children, but few tools to take back all the deportees.
- To clear the liberated territories of Ukraine of explosive ordnance, 10 battalions and three companies have been established. Lieutenant General Oleksandr Pavliuk, First Deputy Minister of Defense of Ukraine, reported that over 174 thousand square kilometers of Ukraine's territory are potentially contaminated with explosive devices and require demining.
- Starting January 1, the enemy will stop providing medical services to Ukrainians who refuse to accept Russian passports in the temporarily occupied territories. Such restrictions are already in place in Starobilsk (Luhansk Oblast), where Ukrainians without a Russian passport are denied medical services, and pharmacies do not dispense medicines under social programs.
- Two underground hospitals will be set up in Kherson. One will house an underground perinatal complex with maternity and postpartum wards, intensive care units, and an operating room. The second facility will function as an underground clinical hospital with an operating room and an intensive care unit.
- During the Crimea occupation, Russians forcibly deported 100,000 Ukrainians who lived on the peninsula. The occupation authorities settled 800,000 Russians in place of the deported Ukrainians, as reported by the Ukrainian Helsinki Human Rights Union and ISW. The key elements of the occupiers' policy that changed the demography were as follows: preferential mortgage lending, relocation of the Russian military, law enforcement, government, medical and educational workers, judges with their families, the expulsion of Ukrainians to the mainland of Ukraine, and encouragement of Ukrainians to move to Russian territory. The aggressor state is pursuing an identical policy in other occupied territories, but now it is not as successful as in Crimea.
- Despite ongoing shelling and active hostilities, there are still about 1,200 civilians in Avdiivka, as stated by Vitalii Barabash, head of the City Military Administration. Barabash claims that people are currently facing problems with food and water supplies, as there is only one highway to supply food and it is under constant shelling.
- The occupation authorities in the temporarily occupied territories threaten to fine Ukrainians who do not register with the 'military commissariats'. The National Resistance Center reports that the Russians continue to covertly mobilize the population in the occupied territories. In this way, the occupiers carry out both passportization and mobilization of the population, as obtaining a Russian passport is a prerequisite for registration.
- During the first meeting of the International Coalition for the Return of Ukrainian Children, Andrii Kostin, Prosecutor General of Ukraine, noted that 3,440 war crimes against children are currently under investigation in Ukraine.
